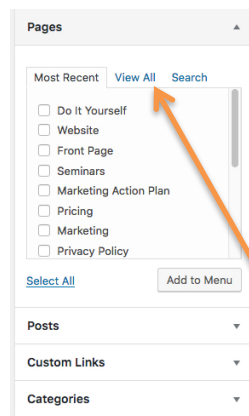
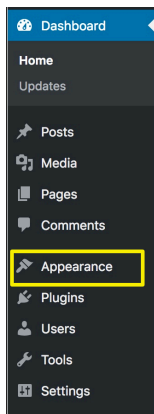
DIVI ADVANCED – ADDING PAGES

The Top Bar or Menu is called the Header. The header will house most of the pages.

Creating new pages or re-naming and re-ordering them in the header or footer is via:

- Appearance
- Menus



It will default to Most Recent pages but you can change it to View All pages.

How to add, edit, remove navigation menu items in Wordpress

Common pages that are most important to the first time website visitor are given a name and placed in the Header menu. Typical examples are:

- Home
- Services
- Pricing
- Online Shop
- About
- Contact

Some websites will have pages that are not as important and appear in the Footer menu. Typical examples are:

- Terms and Conditions
- Privacy Policy
- Refund Policy

Pages other than traditional pages, for example, blog articles, portfolios, shop categories and even external websites can be placed in either the Header or Footer via the Menu. This is done through the custom link.

One Page site navigation

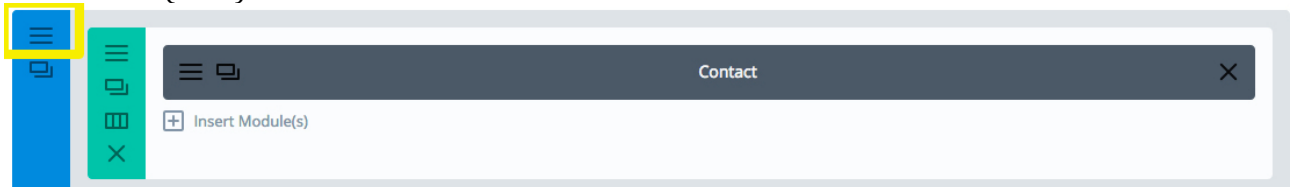
One page sites have sections that are navigated to rather than pages. These sites are designed with the mobile user in mind. Website visitors on a mobile scroll up and down to see and read content. Desktop visitors will use the top menu.

A typical example of a menu item on a one page site is the Contact or Booking section. The link for the section is achieved through using a hashtag to navigate to an anchor point.



For an anchor point to work, it first needs to be set up on the page. This is created by editing the Section (blue).



Add in a CSS ID in the Advanced tab.
