DIVI BLOGS - ADDING A BLOG ARTICLE

There are two things you need to be comfortable with before adding a blog article. They are:

- 1. how to edit text in Divi
- 2. how to use the Media Library in WordPress

EDIT TEXT

ADDING A BLOG ARTICLE

Preparation for adding a blog article includes:

- Writing 300 1,000 word article
- Selecting and re-sizing an image
- Identifying the keyword or keyphrase (if optimising article for search engines)

KEYWORD

The keyword (or keyphrase) is important for your **S**earch **E**ngine **O**ptimisation (SEO). We cover SEO in another course.

Do not copy and paste text from a Word document for your blog article.

- Do not format text (eg. bold & bullet points) in Microsoft Word.
- Format text in WordPress after you have added the text in.

Microsoft Word has coding that you cannot see, but WordPress will read. It frequently will make you blog article strange. Copy the text into a Text Edit file first (Mac) or Notepad (PC). Here's a video for PC users <u>https://youtu.be/-PLKypLO1hY</u>. Use Ctrl V for paste (PC) or Command V for paste (Mac).

Alternatively use the "paste as text" functionality in the editor

There are 10 steps to adding a blog article.

- 1. Log into the WordPress Dashboard
- 2. Post Add New
- 3. Add Title
- 4. Right Hand-Side Settings
 - a. Add Category
 - b. Add Image
 - c. Add Excerpt
- 5. Use Divi Builder
 - a. Choose page
- 6. Publish
- 7. Divi Page Settings
- 8. Add and Format article text
- 9. Add Excerpt
- 10. Check out on live site

LOG INTO WORDPRESS DASHBOARD

Using your username and password log into your WordPress dashboard.

POST - ADD NEW

Left hand side click on "Posts" and then "Add New" button

ADD TITLE


Add the title or headline for the blog post in the blank field at the top. Add this right from the start and before the article is published, as this determines the URL.





RIGHT HAND SIDE SETTINGS

Add Category Scroll up and on right hand side choose the category Articles



Add Image From the right hand side set the Featured Image


Click on the purple "Use **Divi** Builder" button

Choose Page

PUBLISH

Scroll up and click on the publish button on the right

Publish

Even though the new content has not yet been put in, check the article is up on the site with the new title, new image and in the right category. Go over to the live site and check (you may need to refresh the page).

If the URL is too long, change it now to a simple one (retain the keyword in it)

At this point the page may have two sidebars. Don't worry – go in and change this next.

DIVI PAGE SETTINGS

Use the Edit Post (top black bar menu) to get to the WordPress Post settings page.



Right hand side

Go back in after Divi Builder and choose full width (it isn't there at the beginning, the full width choice only becomes available after the Divi Builder has been selected)

- Page Layout Full Width
- Post Title Hide

ADD AND FORMAT ARTICLE TEXT


Remove, add and change text as you would for a page.


Remember to Save your work!

FURTHER READING

Excerpt

The excerpt is the 1 or 2 sentences that appear as a summary on your blog summary page followed by "read more...". For example:





Write an excerpt that is a summary of the blog article and that creates a curiosity for the person to click through to the blog page and want to read it.

The same 1-2 sentences are often used for the meta-description which is part of optimising your blog for Google.

Search Engine Optimisation (SEO)

Writing great content for your website is an excellent way to optimise for being found on Google and other search engines. Have you heard the phrase "Content Marketing?" That's what blogs are all about.

We have a separate course for SEO. This will further enhance your blog writing. SEO is also great for service pages and product pages.
